Mercer Street Friends – Send Hunger Packing Program

Administration presented a request from a member of the public for a proposed program in collaboration with Mercer Street Friends Food Bank to provide free weekend meals on nonperishable foods for students in need. The identification of students benefiting from the program will be done through the schools in a discreet manner and participation will be an optional offering for the parents. The newly organized, Send Hunger Packing, has obtained approval from both townships and will still need to identify their funding sources to be served by Mercer Street Friends Food Bank. The Committee recommended support for the program.

Review Policies/Regulations:

The first set of policies and regulations are mandatory items to remain in compliance for the Comprehensive Equity Plan. The New Jersey Department of Education updated several New Jersey Administrative Code chapters in 2016. These policies and regulations also include revision in the list of protected class of individuals as the recent revision to code includes gender identity or expression and socioeconomic status. In P2260 and P & R 2423, the term Limited English Proficient (LEP) is changed to English Language Learners (ELL).

- P3431.1 Family Leave – Alert 207

The provisions of the NJFLA have not changed; however, the FMLA has been revised for an eligible employee to care for a covered servicemember or veteran. A comprehensive list detailing the two new types of FMLA military leave, "qualifying exigency leave" and "military caregiver leave" has also been incorporated into these Guides. These Policy Guides have also been updated to reflect general FMLA and NJFLA eligibility based on the recent Untied States Supreme Court decision on same sex marriage. These updated Guides provide clarification regarding the use of sick time concurrent with FMLA or NJFLA leave time. These Policy Guides clarify the granting of simultaneous leave to more than one eligible employee from the same family under NJFLA, as well as district requirements under NJFLA for leaves of absence beyond the period of requested family leave. A section addressing the processing of complaints for both FMLA and NJFLA has also been added to these Guides. Strauss Esmay considers these Guides as mandated in compliance with the FMLA and the NJFLA a topic of high importance, even though a Policy on the FMLA or the NJFLA is not required in either law.

- P & R5111 Eligibility of Resident-Nonresident Students – Alert 208
A few recent revisions to N.J.S.A. 18A:38-1 et seq., Persons Who May Attend Schools, and an update to the related administrative code, N.J.A.C. 6A:22
Student Residency, requires several revisions to Policy and Regulation Guides 5111. The two substantive changes resulting from new legislation include a provision to permit a student to remain in school for the remainder of the school year if the move is a result of domestic violence, sexual abuse, or other family crisis and a provision permitting the school district to request from the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission the parent's name and address for use in verifying a student's eligibility for enrollment in the district in the case of a dispute. The additional revisions in the Policy and Regulation Guide provide clarification to existing language or are minor revisions.

- P5460 High School Graduation – Alert 208

A New Jersey Department of Education Memorandum dated January 7, 2016 informed all Chief School Administrators and Charter School Lead Persons of the updated graduation requirements for the Classes of 2016, 2017, 2018, and 2019. The purpose of the Memorandum is to provide districts with updated threshold scores that students will need to achieve on the redesigned PSAT/NMSQT in order to satisfy their assessment graduation requirement. The Memorandum included an updated chart. The updated information on the January 7, 2016 Chart has been incorporated into Policy Guide 5460. The only other revisions in Policy Guide 5460 eliminate some effective dates for the 2008-2009 and 2010-2011 grade nine classes as this grade nine class of students would have graduated high school by this date.

P & R8462 Reporting Potentially Missing or Abused Children – Alert 208 The revised administrative code indicates "... any employee, volunteer, or intern with reasonable cause to suspect or believe a student has attempted or completed suicide shall report the information to a division in the Department of Human Services. The old code had contemplated suicide where the new code has completed suicide. In addition, the old code had the report going to the Department of Children and Families as the new code has the report going to the Department of Human Services. One additional change was made in this updated Policy Guide regarding the telephone number to report abuse. The

updated Guides include the same telephone number to report abuse as the previous Guides and adds "or any other telephone number designated by the appropriate child welfare authorities." This revision will not require the Board to immediately change the Policy in the event the authorities designate another telephone reporting number for reporting purposes.

P &R5330.01 Administration of Medical Marijuana- Alert 208 N.J.S.A. 18A:40-12.22 (P.L. 2015 Chapter 158) was recently approved requiring school districts to develop a policy authorizing parents, guardians, and primary caregivers to assist a student in the medical use of marijuana pursuant to the "Compassionate Use Medical Marijuana Act" (N.J.S.A. 24:6I-1 et seq.) while on school grounds, aboard a school bus, or attending a school-sponsored event. N.J.S.A. 18A:40-12.22 indicates the Policy must: establish protocols for verifying the New Jersey Department of Health registration process for the primary caregiver and the student; identify locations on school grounds where the medical marijuana may be administered; and prohibit the administration of medical marijuana to a student by smoking or other form of inhalation. The legislation indicates the Commissioner of Human Services and the State Board of Education may, in consultation with the Commissioner of Health, adopt rules and regulations. Strauss Esmay has developed a new Policy and Regulation Guide 5330.01 – Administration of Medical Marijuana for school districts to adopt until the New Jersey Department of Education (NJDOE) provides school districts additional guidance.

The administration shared data of the number of students referred for mental health screening. Ninety-three incidents were recorded.

OPRA Request Coordinator

The Administration and Facilities Committee discussed the possible need to create a position of OPRA Request Coordinator based on the significant increase in requests. In the 2004-2014 school years, the number of OPRA requests averaged 10-15 per year. In 2014-15 there were 27 requests. In 2015-16 there were 88 requests. At the time of committee review, the district has received 46 requests for this school year. The Committee will continue to review the data at future meetings.

Policies

Website accessibility – Strauss Esmay

Administration requested policy guidance from Strauss Esmay for a policy to address website accessibility for individuals with disabilities. Strauss Esmay is researching the topic further to determine the legal requirements of such a policy.

P5516 Use of Electronic Communication and Recording Devices (ECRD)

Administration reviewed the Strauss Esmay version of the policy and requested administration to seek further input from Strauss Esmay.

West Windsor Bicycle and Pedestrian Alliance and the Greater Mercer TMA

Community member Yan Mei Wang met with the Committee to propose a Walk to School program that would involve possible grant applications. The Committee will continue to review the information related to the proposal and may pose further questions as appropriate.

NJSIAA Field Hockey Tournament of Champions on 11/14 and 11/16 at High School North

The Committee supports the recommendation by administration and the athletic director to host the NJSIAA Field Hockey Tournament of Champions at High School North. This will be the second year we will host the event.

Substitute Secretary Rate

The Committee reviewed information from the Human Resources Department for substitute secretarial rates. The Committee supports the recommendation to change the substitute rates as proposed: 0 + years \$10.00/hr.; 2 + years \$10.50/hr.; 5 + years \$11.25/hr. change to \$12.50/hr. would all be changed to \$12.00 per hour. The current rate for our most experienced substitute secretaries is \$12.85/hr. and the recommendation is to adjust that rate to \$14.00/hour.

ADA Ramp Access at Maurice Hawk School

Administration described the addition of a handicapped accessible ramp to the front entrance at Maurice Hawk School. The district will work with the district architect to move the project forward.

Lead Water Testing

The district is required to test every fountain and drinking water source as per requirements by the State of New Jersey. Buildings and Grounds will address the testing with an approved vendor.

Memorandums of Agreement – Plainsboro and West Windsor

Administration presented the Memorandum of Agreement between Education and Law Enforcement Officials. The agreement provides guidance to districts and law enforcement on cooperative efforts to address areas of concern where mutual interests exist.

IEP Facilitation Pilot Program Agreement

Administration and the Special Services Department presented information for the district to participate in a pilot agreement with the New Jersey Department of Education, Office of Special Education Programs for a Facilitated Individualized Education Program (IEP). The program provides training for district supervisors and facilitators to assist the district in resolving IEP disagreements with parents/guardians. The program is at no cost to the district and voluntary for both the district and the parents/guardians. A resolution will be on the agenda for approval of this program.

Mr. Duthie reviewed the projects school by school providing the current concerns and historical information as appropriate. The Committee asked for modifications of the list which will be completed by Mr. Duthie. Administration reported on the continued monitoring of potential housing developments in the community and the anticipated impact on school enrollment. The initial fundraising and grant opportunities with Mercer Street Friends has made it possible for meal delivery to begin in early March. The identification of students benefiting from the program will be done through the schools in a discreet manner and participation will be an optional offering for the parents. District administration will be addressing the logistical concerns for the delivery of meals through the Buildings and Grounds Department, school principals and designated contacts at each school.

- <u>Statement of Assurance</u> Administration reviewed the Statement of Assurance required by the NJDOE Office of Special Education. The district must submit the Statement of Assurance to confirm that the above policy changes in the 2000 series have been completed.
- Not Even Once Program Administration shared information about an upcoming training program to include administrators, teachers, student assistance counselors and police for the prevention of heroin addiction facilitated by the Manchester Township Police Department. The program, Not Even Once, was developed and copyrighted by the Manchester Police Department in collaboration with educators and aligns to NJDOE health curriculum standards. The district will host the training session and then discuss the implementation of police facilitated training of students during twelfth grade health.

 - . **P2622** Student Assessment The policy is mandated by the New Jersey Department of Education and replaces terms addressed in the above reference bylaw. New code references the requirement for student participation in PARCC are included.
 - . **P & R5116** Education of Homeless Children The policy and regulation have been updated to remove the term "awaiting foster care placement" from the definition of homelessness. Students in foster care are addressed in Policy 2467.
 - . **P5460** High School Graduation The policy is mandated and includes updated terms as defined in the above reference Bylaw. The new policy addresses the end-of-course PARCC requirements and alternate assessments necessary for graduation. The changes to the policy also include requirements for early graduation thereby abolishing Policy 5465.
 - . **P8350** Records Retention The policy is recommended and the district does comply with the requirements of record retention by the New Jersey Department of Treasury.
 - . R2460.16 Special Education Instructional Material to Blind or Print-Disabled The policy was included along with all other mandated policies for Special Education. This policy did not have any changes, but is to be readopted along with all other special education policies.
 - P7446 School Security Program Tabled

Feedback from the Director of Guidance and Legal Counsel:

. **R2418** – Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 – Students Regulation 2418 was previously approved in February 2017. Further review by the Director of Guidance and 504 Coordinators at the buildings necessitated minor changes that were reviewed and approved by the district legal counsel.

- Additional Policy Discussion:
 - P2460 Special Education The policy was submitted for first reading at the March 28th meeting. At the meeting, a member of the public raised concern to a change in language in item 18 where the word "not" indicated that a parent would be unable to submit a request for referral via email. The word "not" was removed and the wording from the prior version of the policy has replaced the version submitted for March 28th.
 - P2468 Independent Educational Evaluations The policy was further reviewed by legal counsel. Item 3f has been removed the requirement of an independent evaluator being required to communicate with the pupil's case manager. In "Additional Considerations" language that limited the timeframe from the date of an eligibility conference to 12 months to request and Independent Educational Evaluation has been removed.
- Maurice Hawk School Expansion Administration discussed the recommendation to designate capital reserve in the amount of \$12.5 million for the purpose of expansion at Maurice Hawk School.
- Review 2018-19 School Calendar: The Committee further reviewed the most recent version of the proposed calendar for the 2018-19 school year. The calendar is to be reviewed with PTA leadership and the Superintendent's Advisory Council on April 25th. The Committee plans to recommend a final calendar for approval in May.
