WWP SAFETY & SECURITY: MAIN COMPONENTS

- Physical Safety & Security
- Technology Infrastructure
- Social & Emotional Safety & Security

EYES ON THE DOOR OFFICERS

- Primary Role: Monitor main entrance and lobby of school buildings
- Process each visitor using visitor management technology: Raptor Technology
- Raptor Technology: Scan government issued ID
- Customer Service: Meeting and greeting the public
- Building Checks: Monitor entrances and exits throughout school buildings
- Building relationships with school community

EYES ON THE DOOR: RAPTOR TECHNOLOGY

Raptor has the most reliable and up-to-date U.S. sex offender database check available.

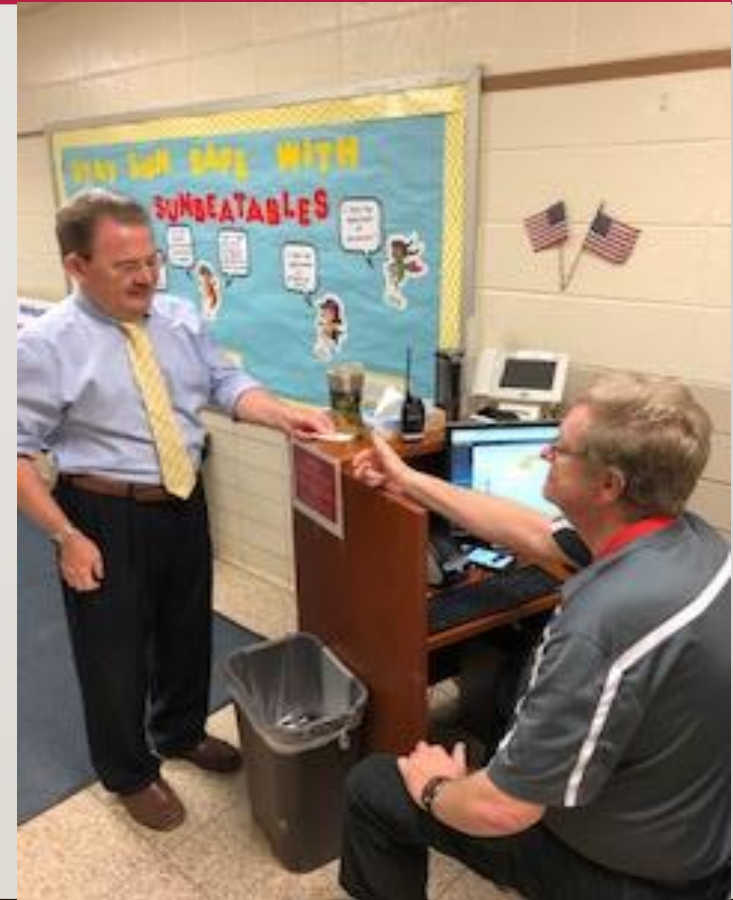
Each visitor is instantly screened against registered sex offender databases in all 50 states.

Building administrators will process all “Alerts.”



EYES ON THE DOOR: CUSTOMER SERVICE

Eyes on the Door Officers greet and welcome visitors and community members



EYES ON THE DOOR: NEXT STEPS

- Continued Customer Service Training
- Recruit, Screen, Interview and Select New Candidates

NEW SECURITY TECHNOLOGY

- Cameras: Over 700 new HD cameras, access from remote locations, emergency-officers can access for assistance
- Strobes: Outside and inside
- Message Boards: Broadcast specific details
- Classroom Telephones: Teachers can use for emergencies
- Keyless Entry Access Upgrade
- Single Wire: Technology which allows devices to communicate

NEW SECURITY TECHNOLOGY: HD CAMERAS

Indoor and outdoor cameras cover majority of school campus



NEW SECURITY TECHNOLOGY: STROBES

Indoor and outdoor strobes to alert students and staff of emergencies



NEW SECURITY TECHNOLOGY: CLASSROOM PHONES

Classroom phones installed at teachers desk

Teachers will have ability to active lockdown

Calls can be made from class to class/office or to parents



NEW SECURITY TECHNOLOGY: MESSAGE BOARDS

Broadcast messages inside and outside each building in case of emergencies

Examples: “Fire Emergency, Please Evacuate,”
“Lockdown, Internal Threat”

Lights will flash

NEW SECURITY TECHNOLOGY: NEXT STEPS

- Testing Devices: June-July (First test on Friday, 6/14/19 after school at Wicoff Elementary)
- Training staff in September
- Full implementation in 2019-2020 school year

CLASS III OFFICERS

- Officers Assigned to 8 of the 10 schools
- Rigorous screening and interview process
- Primary Role: Building Security in the event of Violent Critical Incident
- Monitors doors, windows, high traffic areas, lunches, entry and dismissal
- Building Relationships with students, faculty and staff
- Safety Education: Elementary, Middle, High School
- Building Checks: Inside and outside the building

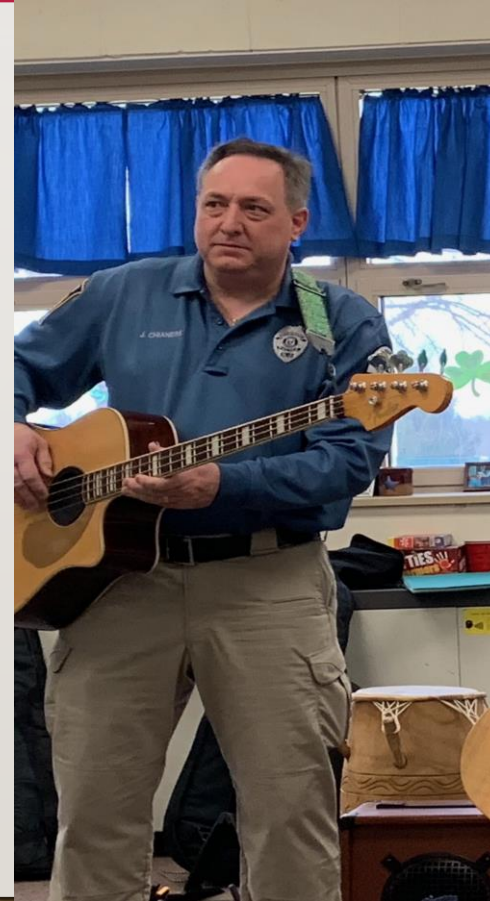
