Mrs. Davison's class read the story, *Teacup*, and loved the book so much that they decided to write to the author and illustrator. The author and illustrator wrote back to the class. Thank you to Mrs. Mulhall and Mrs. Davison for this experience. Please enjoy the letters below:

3rd Grade Letter to the Author and Illustrator of Teacup

Dear Ms. Young and Mr. Ottley,

We are a third-grade class at Maurice Hawk in West Windsor, New Jersey and your book <u>Teacup</u> has really spoken to us. Both the pictures and the words in the story work so well together to help us understand the story. After many reads and discussions, the

message we get from the book is that sometimes you will have to journey alone, but there is always a happy place and people where you can make a new beginning.

Some ideas we had about the book were:

- Maybe the stronger roots of the boy's tree represent that he is home and the girl's tree on the beach with no roots in the ground means that she is still looking for her place?
- We think the footprint part of the illustration on the last page might be drawn to look like the sign language sign for I love you.
- The last page illustration with the pear and the apple, seems like symbols or a message that shows the boy and girl's friendship.
- We thought a lot about the page with the animals changing into clouds. We felt like memories might be fading away. Maybe things he had in his old life were disappearing?

We did have a couple of questions about the book and your writing process:

- 1. Was the story originally a poem that you made into a book?
- 2. How were you paired together as author/illustrator?
- 3. Why did you write this story? Did you put your lives into the story and illustrations?

As you can see, we have done a lot of big thinking about the story and we hope you can help us continue our discussion.
