IMPORTANT:

- Grade level schedules for the Nov. 25 half-day schedule, are linked below. This schedule applies to both hybrid and all-virtual students.
 - Maurice Hawk <u>half-day</u> preschool is closed.
 - Elementary schools will operate on a <u>conference day schedule</u> allowing students to experience all classes in the morning.
 - Middle schools will operate on a <u>half-day schedule</u>.
 - High schools will operate on a <u>40-minute six period-half day schedule</u> allowing students to experience all scheduled classes for that day in the morning.
- The District will be closed Nov. 26-27 for the Thanksgiving Break.
- WW-P will move to a temporary full-remote model after the Thanksgiving holiday weekend. Beginning Nov. 30 Dec. 9, the District and all instruction will remain fully remote.
- The District will resume in-person for those students who participate in the hybrid and all-in instruction models with <u>Hybrid 2 on Thursday, December 10,</u> and <u>Hybrid 1 on Monday, Dec. 14</u>.
- Upon the conclusion of Winter Recess (Dec. 23, 2020 Jan. 1, 2021) the district will observe a 14 day temporary move to full-remote learning beginning Monday, Jan. 4, 2021, through Monday, Jan. 18.
