Participants

Students registered in the West Windsor-Plainsboro School District in grades K-5 may participate in after-school enrichment.

Payment Policy

Payment is due at the time of registration and is to be made online. Your child(ren)'s space in the program is not secure until the payment transaction has been completed.

You may pay by e-check or credit card online.

**There is a 2.8% transaction fee for all credit card payments.*

**There is a \$40 returned (bounced) check fee.*

There is also a \$10 non-refundable registration fee.

Withdrawal & Refund Policy

Withdrawals for a refund will be accepted **on or before 12:00 p.m. on Tuesday, April 2, 2024**. An electronic withdrawal form is available at [www.ww-p.org](#), under Departments, Community Education, Enrichment Programs or can be found by clicking [here](#).

A withdrawal will only be processed once the form has been received by the Community Education office. *Phone withdrawals are not accepted*. Because programs are vendor based, withdrawals requested after the withdrawal date will not be refunded.

**Credit card transaction fees, registration fees and bounced check fees cannot be refunded.*

Illness, Absence & Quarantine

Your child must be present at school dismissal in order to stay for enrichment. If your child is absent or picked up early from their school day and not signed back in (marked present by the main office), they may not attend enrichment. No refunds or credits will be given for illness, school absences or required quarantines.

Program Cancellations

All vendors require Community Education to reach a minimum enrollment in order to run their program. If the minimum number is not met, Community Education will send a cancellation notice via email. You may request a refund or register your child into another program. Registration fees are refunded if a program is cancelled due to low enrollment.

Late Pick-Up

The program ends at 4:40pm. Parents arriving after 4:40p.m. are subject to a late fee of \$15 for the first 10 minutes of lateness and \$1.00 per minute thereafter.

Frequently Asked Questions

After School Enrichment

- **When is the registration fee and payment for programs due?**

The non-refundable \$10 registration fee and full payment is due at the time of registration. You can make the payment using an e-check or credit card. There is a 2.8% service fee for all credit card transactions.

- **What time is enrichment?**

All classes begin at 3:40pm and end promptly at 4:40pm. A parent, guardian or authorized adult must come to specified pick up location and sign your participant out after each enrichment class. Pick up persons arriving after 4:40pm will be charged a late fee of \$15 for the first 10 minutes of lateness and \$1.00 per minute thereafter. EDP students will be escorted back to their EDP program.

- **My child does not meet the grade requirement for a particular program. Can he or she still participate?**

Your child may not participate in the program if they do not meet the minimum grade requirement.

- **Is financial assistance available?**

Contact the Community Education department with financial assistance questions.

- **What happens if my child is waitlisted for a program?**

Vendors set a maximum number of registrants. When that number is met, the class will close and a waitlist will begin to generate. When a waitlist is generated, there is no guarantee your child will get into the program. If a space becomes available, the Community Education office will contact you. You may want to choose another program option if your child is placed on the waitlist.

- **Is transportation provided after enrichment is over?**

Transportation is not provided for any Community Education after school program.

- **Does my child need to bring anything?**

Your child does not need to bring anything to enrichment. A water bottle is recommended if your child is in a sports program.

Can my child switch programs once enrichment has started?

No. Our vendors are independently owned and operated. Payments are made prior to the start of the actual program. Therefore, Community Education cannot switch your child from one program to another once classes have begun.

My child no longer wants to attend a class. Do I get a refund?

Because these programs are vendor based, there are no refunds for missed classes or if your child does not wish to attend.

Why are the same programs not offered at all schools?

Community Education works with vendors to determine how many staff they are able to send out to run programs. Class schedules change from fall to winter to spring. You may end up seeing a program at your child's location later on in the school year.

Can my child attend a program at a different location?

If there is space available at a different location, your child may enroll. However, there is no transportation between schools for enrichment. You must contact Community Education before enrolling at a different location.

If I pick my child up early from school, can they still attend enrichment?

Your child must be marked present at the time of school dismissal. If you pick up early and do not return to school and sign in with the main office, your child may NOT attend enrichment.

My child was absent from school. Can they come back to attend enrichment?

Your child must be present for the school day in order to attend enrichment. There are no credits or refunds for absences or quarantines.

Behavioral Expectations

Community Education programs create an environment in which our children are encouraged to develop an appreciation of their own rights, responsibilities and the rights of others. Rules will be outlined on the first day of enrichment. When a rule is broken, a class or individual review of the rules is usually enough to correct inappropriate behavior. Rules may vary from classroom to classroom, but the general principles are all similar. If a behavioral problem arises the following steps will be instituted:

First: verbal warning

Second: call to the parent

Third: meeting with parent, child, and Program Administrator

Fourth: recommendation for dismissal

Community Education reserves the right to alter the above action steps given the severity of behavioral issue.
